Motivation

- expropriation is needed and makes sense because of public good
- in agrarian sector, it could result in extreme hardship
- land consolidation for special operations
 - as milder instrument instead of expropriation
 - can be used for realisation of further aims to improve the agricultural structure

Sovereign proceedings of land reallocation in Germany

- land consolidation in rural area:
 - normally serving private interest
 - exception: land consolidation for special operations
 - statutory basis: Flurbereinigungsgesetz

- land reallocation in urban area:
 - always serving private interest
 - statutory basis: Baugesetzbuch



- for the supply of land in considerable size at a certain place:
 - more than 5 ha
 - basis:

official approval of a plan or binding land-use plan


 examples: highway, country roads, district roads, bypass, railway, airport etc



GIH Land consolidation for special operations

 distribute the expected land loss on a wider circle

 disadvantages on account of damages of divisions, detours, wrong forms, rest properties are removed or minimized


 land consolidation "Goltern" in Barsinghausen

Location







Barsinghausen

- medium-sized town in region of Hanover
- affected by the ridge "Deister" in the south-west
- procedure includes 1.914 ha of agricultural land
- only a few agricultural roads
- lower lying villages are affected by high water
- poor situation of public road



Causes for initiation

- straightening of a federal road in area and adjustment of a crossing which is affected by accidents
- creation of a by-pass
- creation of agricultural roads
- improvement of the ecological situation of the water bodies
- mitigation of the danger of high water






Border of Consolidation Area Realized Agricultural Roads Planned Agricultural Roads Realized Water Bodies Landscape Management Measures




 straightening of a federal road and adjustment of a crossing










provision of land for by-pass






• consolidation of agricultural land



situation of a farm after consolidation






- measures of compensation

Nienburg at Weser


- medium-sized town between Hanover and Bremen in rural area
- Area is situated in south of Nienburg
- two subareas:
 - Südring:
 - ca. 62 ha area
 - agricultural use
 - Segelwiesen in the center of Nienburg:
 - ca. 22 ha area
 - currently agricultural use



Relationship between urban and rural realloction

- land consolidation:
 - sectoral (integrated) planning and sectoral measures
 - is not only justified at agrarian property → includes further surfaces like roads, paths, water bodies
 - is bounded to binding land-use plans and has no priority
- plan according to sec. 41 FlurbG (road and drainage plan with landscape preservation plan)
 - connection to urban planning
 - realisation of planning of the land consolidation by effect of permission because of official approval of a plan



Relationship between urban and rural realloction

• either:

accordance of entitled person assumed, land consolidation administration and municipality (reallocation department) can allocate a parcel in each other procedure

- precondition: area of land reallocation is not part of area of land consolidation
- surrogate principle ⇒ property has to continue always: new legal situation of land reallocation and land consolidation has to begin at the same time
- or:

double membership of a parcel in an area of land reallocation and land consolidation is allowed as well

- accordance of entitled person is not assumed
- indefeasibility of land reallocation can chronologically precede:
 land reallocation takes place of primarily stock in the land consolidation
- land consolidation principles must be kept



Relationship between urban and rural realloction

- sometimes land consolidation makes sense with urban planning at its beginning
 - municipality: planning responsibility
 - land consolidation can cause a demand of planning:
 - change of preparatory land use plan
 - preparation of a binding land use plan
- land consolidation is not totally bounded on agrarian used parcels:
 - can not be used, only to provide building land
 - representations / designations of planning law are bounded by urban land use planning



Synergy by linkage

- compensation of both procedures in "Segelwiesen"
- change of agricultural area from "Segelwiesen" to "Südring"
 - otherwise expensive infrastructure provision is needed
 - restriction because of flood plain
- no need for alternative land of supralocal greenfields in land reallocation because of land consolidation:
 - marginal strip between reallocation area and water bodies could be purchased by statement of abandonment of land according to sec. 52 FlurbG
 - renaturation of water bodies by land consolidation
 - resp. realisation of recreational zones → subvention of general land improvement



Conclusions

The land consolidation for special operations

- ... as instrument, to ease expropriation (proportionality of means)
- ... as instrument, in addition to satisfy further requirements of rural land
- ... as balance between private and public interests
